Our school district is in regular communication with the Santa Rosa County Health Department for guidance in both prevention and intervention measures. We will continue to respond to their lead and guidance on all matters impacting the health and safety of our students, staff, parents, and community members.

Students/Staff that are ill: Based on the illness, any employee or student suspected of having the flu or coronavirus symptoms would follow Health Department guidelines and contact the health department or a physician to discuss concerns. The student could return to school when no longer sick. If applicable, the health department and medical professionals will guide ill individuals regarding their illness status for return to school/work/community activities.

Travel Advisory

Current FDOH and FDOE guidelines for travel:

- Anyone (students/faculty/staff/etc.) who goes on foreign travel, to any country, must self-isolate for 14 days upon return.
- Anyone (students/faculty/staff/etc.) who goes on a cruise, anywhere, must self-isolate for 14 days upon return.

- Any staff/Faculty who has visited New York or New Jersey and FLEW back to Florida should self quarantine for 14 days

Definitions

Self-Isolation: means self-driven separation of a person or group of people known or reasonably believed to be *infected with a communicable disease and potentially infectious* from those who are not infected to prevent spread of the communicable disease. Persons that are self-isolating should practice remain at home and practice social distancing.

Self-monitoring: means people should monitor themselves for fever by taking their temperatures twice a day and remain alert for cough or difficulty breathing. If they feel feverish or develop measured fever, cough, or difficulty breathing during the self-monitoring period, they should self-isolate, limit contact with others, and seek advice by telephone from a healthcare provider or their local health department to determine whether medical evaluation is needed.

Self-observation: means people should remain alert for subjective fever, cough, or difficulty breathing. If they feel feverish or develop cough or difficulty breathing during the self-observation period, they should take their temperature, self-isolate, limit contact with others, and seek advice by telephone from a healthcare provider or their local health department to determine whether medical evaluation is needed.

Social distancing means remaining out of congregate settings, avoiding mass gatherings, and maintaining distance (approximately 6 feet or 2 meters) from others when possible.

Congregate settings are crowded public places where close contact with others may occur, such as shopping centers, movie theaters, stadiums.

1. Employees should pay attention to advisories by the Florida Department of Health before, during and after travel.
2. Please be advised the restrictions on employees are contingent on the advisories of the CDC and Florida Department of Health and could change daily. Please be advised a “may” today could be a “shall” tomorrow.
